



Community Tree Programs

The Community Tree Programs include new and existing programs that will help grow our urban forest and increase tree canopy cover citywide, helping us meet the goals in our <u>Urban Forest Plan</u>. Why trees? They provide a wealth of benefits, from cleaner air to cooler streets, making Bellingham a healthier, happier place for our community and environment. The City already plants thousands of trees on public property each year through a variety of programs. In 2024, we are investing in additional programs to encourage more tree planting on private property. Learn more below to find a program that's right for you!



Tree Coupons Starting in Fall 2024, we will offer tree coupons to Bellingham community members to reduce the costs of planting trees on private property.



Tree Giveaways Visit us at several community events between September and April to pick up a free tree sapling for your yard.



Neighborhood Grants Neighborhood Associations can apply for small grants to plant trees in their neighborhoods.



Parks Volunteer Program This long-standing program hosts volunteer work parties and supports stewardship in local parks.



Community Partnerships We will be working with local non-profit organizations to plant trees on private property. More info coming soon!
