Subject: Contract Award for the Neighborhood Overlays (ES559) Bid #53B-2024

Summary Statement: The Neighborhood Overlays project proposes to overlay specific street segments in the Silver Beach and Samish Neighborhoods in order to help preserve the City's pavement assets. The project will also include installing a new water main along Northshore Drive, ADA ramp upgrades, and a rectangular rapid flashing beacon on Electric Avenue near Flynn Street. The City publicly opened two bids on August 7, 2024. Granite Construction Company is the responsible bidder who submitted the lowest responsive bid of \$1,813,923.86, including sales tax. The engineer's estimate was \$2,028,000. The project is subject to the apprenticeship program requirements of BMC 4.94. An apprenticeship utilization requirement of 15% of project labor hours has been included in this project.

BACKGROUND:

The City of Bellingham Public Works Engineering division designs and constructs projects to maintain and improve our roadway system and preserve the City's pavement assets. The projects are coordinated with other utility replacements to minimize construction impacts to the public.

The Neighborhood Overlays project proposes to overlay with new asphalt pavement the following streets: Flynn Street from near Electric Avenue to Decatur Street, Northshore Drive from Hayward Drive to Silver Beach Street, Academy Road from Northshore Drive to the City Limits, Sylvan Street from Alabama Street to Silver Beach Avenue, and 40th Street from Mill Avenue to Donovan Avenue and from Wildwood Drive to Bennett Avenue. The project will also install a new water main along Northshore Drive, perform Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant ramp upgrades at intersections along the proposed streets, and install a new Rapid Rectangular Flashing Beacon (RRFB) system at a pedestrian crossing on Electric Avenue near Flynn Street.

These streets were selected for overlay in coordination with the Public Works Operations Division and utilizing the City's pavement management system.

Construction is expected to begin by late summer/fall 2024. As portions of this project are in the Lake Whatcom watershed some paving may occur in spring of 2025.

EVALUATION:

The City advertised the project on July 17, 2024 and publicly opened bids on August 7, 2024. The City received two bids. Granite Construction Company was the responsible bidder who submitted the lowest responsive bid of \$1,813,923.86, including sales tax. The engineer's estimate for the project was \$2,028,000. Funding for this project is from the Street Fund. The project is subject to the apprenticeship program requirements of BMC 4.94. An apprenticeship utilization requirement of 15% of project labor hours has been included in this project.






Pavement Condition Index (PCI) Method



Understanding the PCI Score




Bellingham Average Street Condition

2024 Neighborhood Overlays Vicinity Map



BID PROPOSAL

To the City of Bellingham:

The undersigned bidder declares that he/she has carefully examined the Bid Documents, including the Contract Plans, Provisions, and Specifications for the construction of the NEIGHBORHOOD OVERLAYS ES-559, project, has made an examination of the site of the proposed work, has made such investigations as are necessary to determine the conditions to be encountered, and that if this Bid Proposal is accepted, he/she will contract with the City of Bellingham, Washington (the "City"), in the form of contract hereto annexed, and will to the extent of his bid provide the necessary machinery, tools, apparatus and other means of construction, and will furnish all materials and labor as specified in the manner herein specified and according to the requirements of the Engineer.

The bidder agrees that they will complete all work as required within 90 working days. The bidder further agrees that they will pay liquidated damages for delay in completion as specified in Standard Specification 1-08.9.

No Washington State Sales Tax will be paid by the City on labor or services on street related items of work. For street related items of work, the bidder shall include within the various bid item prices or other contract amounts any contractor-paid Washington State Retail Sales Tax on materials, equipment, or supplies used or consumed in doing the work. For non-street related items of work, including water and sewer, Washington State Retail Sales Tax will be paid by the City and the amount of such tax shall be separately stated by the bidder in the space provided on this Bid Proposal form.



Previous Council Action: City Council adopted the 2024 Bicycle Master Plan on May 20, 2024, which includes policy support for implementing the Bike Locker Program

Fiscal Impact: Funding for the project was included in the 2023-2024 Budget and about \$44,000 has been spent on bike locker equipment, plus assembly and installation by City Staff

SUMMARY

During development of the 2023-2024 City Budget, City Council requested the addition of funding to install bicycle lockers in Downtown in order to provide more secure storage options for people walking and rolling. To implement the new bicycle locker program, the City's Parking Rate and Enforcement Schedule needs to be revised to establish hourly Bike Locker User Fees. These user fees help ensure a convenient and efficient experience for people using the bike lockers.

BACKGROUND

Funds for the bicycle locker program were appropriated in the Parking Fund and the plan was originally scoped to install ten bike lockers at the Commercial Street Parking Garage. While developing specifications for the bike lockers, Public Works collaborated with the Planning and Community Development Department, and Whatcom Transportation Authority (WTA) to identify strategic locations for the bike lockers. Ultimately, it was determined that the best approach would be to install bike lockers at both the Commercial Street Parking Garage and adjacent to the WTA Bellingham Station transit center. Installing the bike lockers at these two locations will increase community awareness of the program by making the lockers more visible, increase convenience for people commuting and visiting by providing secure long-term bike storage options at two locations in Downtown, and increase access to transit by providing a secure first-mile/last-mile solution for transit riders who are interested in accessing the many bus routes that converge at the Bellingham Station. The available funding and space allowed for 14 bike lockers – six near the Commercial Street Parking Garage and eight near WTA Bellingham Station.

Staff performed extensive market research on management strategies and user fees, also referred to as rental rates, for the bike locker program. It was determined that a mobile application (app) was the industry standard for managing and renting bike lockers. Movatic is the name of the app that was procured with the bike lockers. They are a worldwide leader in multimodal rentals. The City's Information Technology, Legal and Finance Departments have all approved the use of the app for the City.

Earlier this year the Transportation Commission reviewed and endorsed the implementation of the bike locker program including the proposed rates set forth in the attached resolution. The program also aligns with the Programmatic Actions recommendations in chapter seven of the newly adopted 2024 Bicycle Master Plan, which includes providing additional bike parking and states that it "should be strategically placed to provide safe and accessible places for short- and long-term bike parking. Secure long-term, covered bike lockers should be provided at transit facilities...".

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approve the Bike Locker User Fees as listed in section five of the attached resolution.







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RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BELLINGHAM ADOPTING A REVISED PARKING RATE SCHEDULE TO ADD A BIKE LOCKER USER FEE

WHEREAS, Bellingham Municipal Code Section 2.44.060 provides that on-street and cityowned off-street parking rates are to be determined by the Public Works Director and approved by City Council, with an opportunity for input from the Transportation Commission; and

WHEREAS, the City is preparing to install bike lockers at various locations in Bellingham and make them available for public use, subject to a reasonable fee to be established in this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, City Council last updated public parking rates and enforcement hours in 2022 pursuant to Council Resolution 2022-24; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution restates the parking fees and rates contained in Resolution 2022-24 and adds a new Section 5 to establish a user fee for City bike lockers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLINGHAM THAT:

This Parking Rate and Enforcement Schedule supersedes and replaces in its entirety the one contained in Resolution 2022-24.

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS

"Metered parking" means on-street parking and off-street city-owned parking designated as metered parking.

"Permit parking" means on-street parking and off-street city-owned parking designated as permit parking.

SECTION 2. METERED PARKING

A. Rates for Metered Parking

Effective May 1, 2022 (flat rate) \$1.00 per hour Effective January 1, 2023 (progressive rate) Hours 1 and 2: \$1.50 per hour Hours 3 and 4: \$2.00 per hour Hours 5 and 6: \$3.00 per hour Hours 7 and 8: \$5.00 per hour

B. Hours of Enforcement for Metered Parking (Effective May 1, 2022)

Hours of enforcement of metered parking shall be 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday. No enforcement on Sunday.

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C. Service Provider Fees for Metered Parking

Transaction fees charged by third-party providers for payments by mobile device shall be in addition to the metered rates established in this resolution.

SECTION 3. PERMIT PARKING (Effective February 1, 2023)

Permit applications and processing shall follow usual and customary business practices of the City of Bellingham Finance Department as now exists or as may be promulgated or modified by the Finance Director.

A. Rates for Off-street Permit Parking

Commercial Street Garage (1300 Commercial) Floors 2-5 \$30.00 per month Mezzanine (alley access) \$95.00 per month Permit required 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Railroad Avenue Garage (1215 Railroad)Floor 2\$80.00 per monthStreet Level\$105.00 per monthPermit required 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Depot Market Lot (1100 Railroad)

\$65.00 per month Permit required 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Central Avenue Lot (West of Prospect, near Post Office) \$75.00 per month

Permit required 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

B. Rates for On-street Permit Parking

North Railroad (1500 block Railroad Avenue)

\$25.00 per month

Permit required at all times.

McKenzie (1000 block McKenzie Avenue) \$65.00 per month

Permit required 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

C. Low-income Discount for Permit Parking

The permit rates established in this section shall be reduced by 80% for full-time residents of subsidized low-income housing located within a parking management zone that is eligible for the utility discount established in BMC 15.04.070(C), subject to a limit of one discounted permit per household per permit period. As set forth in BMC 15.04.070(C), eligible low-income housing means housing provided by nonprofit agencies and public housing authorities, such

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as the Bellingham Housing Authority or other similar entity, receiving public funds for low income housing, with rents restricted by a federal, state or city housing program for households earning less than 60 percent of area median income (AMI). The application process and means of verifying eligibility shall be determined by the Finance Director or his or her designee. Permits shall be issued on a first come, first serve basis and are subject to availability.
